Shared editors

Examples: Shredit, Aspect

Several users can access the same document at the same time


Any change made by any user is immediately shown on the screens of other members

Members need not look at the same window at the same time

Advantage: Flexible, does not restrict usage patterns

Compare to whiteboard, but everyone can write at the same time


Anonymity causes equality



Forums=groups=conferences=activities=news groups=applications

Open (public)

Closed (private)

Open to a restricted set

Write-protected

Can non-members submit?

Are anonymous and pseduonymous contributions allowed

Contributions

Basic forum system functionality

Submit contributions to forum name

Remove or modify your own contribution

Sending one contribution to more than one forum

and not forcing recipients to read it more than once

Subscribe to open (public) forums

Moderator can add members to closed (private) forums

Members can unsubscribe from forums

Members can retrieve old and new contributions

even those written before the member joined the forum

various retrieval functions may be available

Read contributions in a structured way

By conference, by conversation etc.

Ability to skip part of the discussion

By time, by forum, by conversation


Moderator can remove unsuitable contributions, or move them to a more suitable conference

Ability to start new conferences, and to split and merge existing conferences

In pre-moderated forums, contributions must be approved in advance by the moderator





Scheduling meetings example:



Ask all participants to indicate preferred/inconvenient times.

Find a meeting time suitable to all and book a meeting room.

If no meeting time suits all, ask participants to relax their requirements.

If still no meeting time suits all, find meeting time which suits most or the most important participants.

Additional special cases

Important and less important participants.

Priority meeting: May reschedule other meetings.

Need for more than one meeting room.


Objection

This idea of applying computer science methods to social modelling will lead to bankruptcy. Even in a very simple case, the complexity of all the special conditions will be too large. People will not always be able to specify all the conditions. Listen to results from socal and organizational research and give up the idea of CS modelling of tasks.

Lucy Suchman: Do categories have Politics? The Language/Action Perspective Reconsidered

Categorisation: The organisation of people or their activities into a more or less simple typology.

Categorisation is politics. Categorisation is a tool to impose your view on other people, and forcing other people into roles prescribed by certain people on other people.

Speech act theory categorisation is a tool to enforce a simplistic categorisation on people and their actions.

Compare with military discipline: A tool for converting humans into machines, controllable, efficient, reliable, not threatening to authorities.


JP-s comment on 'The coordinator' controversy:

It is a well-known fact that decision making and achieving agreement is more difficult in asynchronous text communication. Thus, tools to make this easier would be useful.

Any successful different time-different place systems must include e-mail which is at least as good as other e-mail systems, so that people can use the new system as a replacement for e-mail with added functionality.


Speech act theory provides one way of structuring interactions which is suitable in some cases. But it is better to allow users to create their own structuring as required by their tasks. Example: Instead of request—commitment, some tasks are better aided by problem-solution-pro-con-structuring.

Workflow ("Ärendehantering") is more general than the Coordinator

Requirement on good workflow application systems

- 1. Simple support for all state transitions, both normal *and* non-normal
- 2. Easy to define revised work-flow state diagram
- 3. Easy to see the status of each work item
- 4. Easy to know which items a certain person has pending
- 5. Support for more than one person doing certain state transitions

Content Management Systems

Manage informational objects with multiple attributes and in multiple languages.

Export to web pages in different formats, static and/or dynamic, web media, printed media and other formats.

Simplify updating of existing information.

Support workflow where needed.

Split the tasks of layout and content production between different people, so that each can do what they are best at. Content experts need less technical knowledge than without content management systems:

- Different kinds of tasks
- Managed by different people
- Change independently of each other
- Easier to reuse both content and layout

In the Netherlands, an estimated two percent each year go to their general practitioner with questions and complaints about their sexuality. Half of these people have sexual problems.
